Position Summary:

The Outreach Worker identifies and engages women who are pregnant, are likely to soon become pregnant, or are parenting and refers them to medical and support services, and follows-up to ensure the connection is made. Reports to the MICHC Program Manager.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Associates Degree (Bachelors preferred) or demonstrated commitment to helping others
- Experience coaching individuals and/or groups
- Relevant knowledge of perinatal health and human service agencies within Rochester
- Relevant knowledge of social determinants of health, the impact of structural racism on health and birth outcomes, and a commitment to culturally responsive care
- Strong experience and competence working with racially, ethnically, and culturally diverse populations in the inner city of Rochester
- Community affiliations in existing efforts to address community health, social determinants of health, or advocacy
- Strong written, verbal, interpersonal, organizational, and problem solving skills
- Fluent in use of the internet and Windows-based computer systems
- Flexible hours, willing to work some evenings and weekends
- Must have reliable transportation and a valid NYS Driver's License

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Ability to walk or move for up to 4 hours and stand for long periods at a time
- Identify target population and areas/places to engage them
- Assess consumer requests for support and refer appropriately
- Document in electronic system outreach attempts, referrals, and follow-up
- Coordinate outreach efforts with agency programs, events, and initiatives
- Maintain knowledge of perinatal health, human services, and community resources
- Maintain a robust understanding of Rochester neighborhoods, their assets, and their challenges
- Demonstrate a high level of professionalism at all times
- Communicate effectively with consumers, their partners, families, and agency staff
- Assess and conduct quality improvement protocols agency programs, outreach efforts, and cultural appropriateness
- Represent agency and program at relevant community collaborations and events
